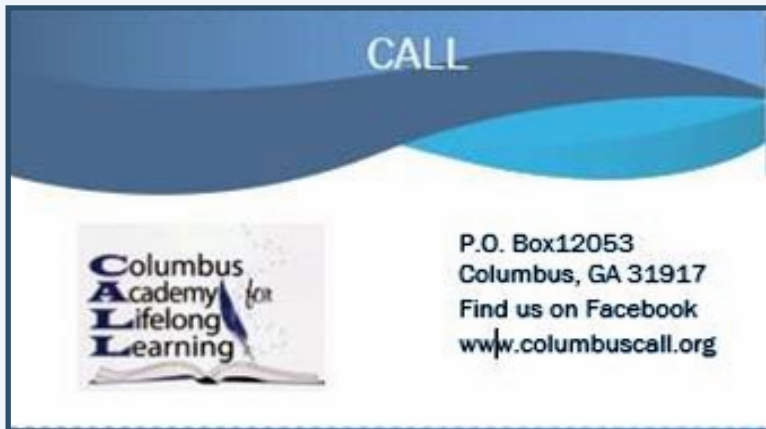

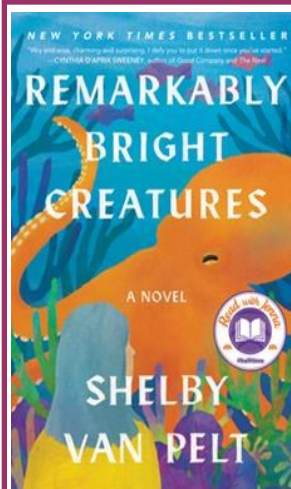

Coffee, Brunch or Lunch at **Banks Food Hall**, 1002 Bay Ave. Members will meet and socialize at the Banks Food Hall where there is a variety of food choices.

At 12:30 p.m. we will walk across the street to the Corn Center.

At 12:30 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. **Bo Bartlett Center and The Illges and Bay Galleries** Located in Columbus State University Corn Center for Visual Arts, 921 Front Ave.

Bo Bartlett Center on the 2nd floor features two exhibits:

“Unstuck in Time: St EOM, Pasaquan, Here, Now”

“Big Stories”

Illges and Bay Galleries on the 1st floor features Columbus State University Student Artwork.

Parking: There is a parking lot adjacent to Banks Food Hall. For those who want to walk from Banks Food Hall (approximately 0.2 miles), we will enter through the back entrance of the Bo Bartlett Center on Dillingham Street.

The city parking garage in front of the RiverCenter has an entrance/exit on Front Ave. and is available for those who wish to join the tour only or have mobility issues. Exit the parking garage using Front Ave. and walk across the street to the entrance of The Corn Center for Visual Arts and Bo Bartlett Center. An elevator in the parking garage and in the Corn Center for Visual Arts is available for your convenience.

Note: For those with mobility issues, it is not advisable to walk to Banks Food Hall from the RiverCenter parking garage.



The Bo Bartlett Center is an 18,425-square-foot interactive gallery space housed on the River Park campus of Columbus State University in downtown Columbus, GA. The red brick, former textile warehouse turned gallery space, designed by AIA award-winning architect, Tom Kundig, sits on the banks of the Chattahoochee River.

Complementing exhibitions in the CSU Department of Art's acclaimed Norman Shannon and Emmy Lou P. Illges Gallery, the Bartlett Center serves as an experiential learning center and cultural hub for the visual arts while affording visitors a broad range of arts experiences offered within the College's arts district. As part of the College of the Arts' Corn Center for Visual Arts, the Bo Bartlett Center is a pivotal element in the continued emergence of a national and international presence.
